





To Chew or Not to Chew?

Have you ever been told that gum can be bad for you? Read this article and decide for yourself.

You may have heard your dentist tell you that you should not chew gum. Some doctors say that chewing too much gum can hurt your jaw and muscles. Doctors also say sugar in gum can cause **cavities**. Cavities are tiny holes in your teeth that can get bigger. If the holes become deep, you can get a toothache. Ouch! If you take good care of your teeth, you won't ever get cavities. One way to do that is to try and chew sugar-free gum whenever you do chew gum.


Do you ever swallow your gum? Some adults say that chewing gum will last for seven years in your stomach if you swallow it. This is false! But that doesn't mean you should swallow gum. You should never swallow large amounts of gum, but swallowing one small piece won't hurt you.

When you swallow chewing gum, it travels into your stomach. Your stomach is one part of your digestive system. It is your stomach's job to break down food. Your stomach can't break down chewing gum like most foods. That doesn't mean the gum will get stuck. Your digestive system will move the gum through your body just like a piece of fruit, or any other food.

Even though gum is safe to swallow, you should try not to. Gum is made for chewing, not swallowing. Some kids can be too young to understand this and should not have gum. Kids under the age of 5 treat gum like candy and try to

swallow it when they are done. If you have a younger brother or sister, always ask an adult before giving them gum.

Chewing and swallowing gum may not hurt you if you don't do it too often. You should always throw away your gum instead of swallowing it, and always try to have sugar-free gum so you can enjoy it without worry. Too much of anything is never good.

All citizens of the United States have the same, or equal, rights. Rights are things people are free to do. When The Constitution was created many people thought it did not protect their rights.



Reduce, Reuse, Recycle

Kids often like to help their teachers and parents. We can all help Mother Earth.

Have you heard "Reduce, Reuse, and Recycle?" You can help save the planet with these words. And the best part? You can do most of these things by yourself!

Reduce: Limit what you use every day. Turn off the faucet while you brush your teeth to save water. You can also turn the light off when you leave a room. Unplugging phone chargers will save energy, too. Turning off your computer while you are not using it will also help save power. Walk or ride a bike to visit a close friend. That will reduce pollution because someone will not be using a car to drive you somewhere.

Reuse: You can reuse things instead of throwing them away. If you make a mistake on one side of the paper, don't throw it away. Turn it over and use the back. Don't buy a book and read it once. Go to the library to get a book and return it when you are done. You can ask your friend to share a favorite game instead of asking for a new one. When you get ready for school, pack your lunch in a plastic container. That way, you can wash it, and there will be less trash. Also, look for ways to help Mother Earth by being creative! Save empty paper towel holders or water bottles and turn them into a fun art project.

Recycle: Don't throw away plastic bottles or cans. You can also collect paper, cardboard, and plastic. All of these can be recycled! Your city may pick these items up at your home and take them to a place where they can be made into

new items. For example, many boxes are made out of recycled cardboard.
Another way to recycle is to use an old item as something new. For example, turn an old t-shirt into a rag for cleaning. By recycling, there will be less trash in the landfills.

You might think of more ways that you can help Mother Earth. Before you throw something away, stop. Ask yourself how you can use this again. You will probably think of some fun ideas! What will you do to help the planet today?

Alexis lost the point, but she smiled anyway. She only wanted to win if she earned it.


